Headteacher Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

Can you identify a modal verb? Or recognise the difference between 'active' and 'passive' voice in a sentence? Or spot a relative clause? If you were able to attend our GPS (Grammar, Spelling and Punctuation) workshops this week you will no doubt be aware that children of seven years of age and upwards are now expected to do the above, to demonstrate that they are meeting or will meet what is now called 'age related expectation'. The writing curriculum is very clear that unless a child can achieve these objectives by the end of year 6, and it also very clear that they must meet ALL of them, then they cannot be judged to have met the required standards as set out by the government. Spelling now plays a significant role in judging a child's ability to write and will also be a limiting factor in a child meeting age related expectation. No matter how inventive, exciting or creative a child's writing is judged to be by teachers, if they are not spelling consistently correctly then they will not be meeting age related expectation. I wonder how Winston Churchill would have felt, being a dyslexic himself. Indeed my wife is not very good at spelling (as she will freely admit) but she constantly reminds me of how much cleverer she is (Which I will freely admit!). We are all for raising standards at Southway and much of the new curriculum is good and worthy. My concern, shared with many teachers and Headteachers, is that the emphasis is now firmly on children demonstrating their grasp on the mechanics of writing and not the joy of writing for pleasure. I believe there is a place for both and at Southway we will continue to develop that love for the written word and prepare children for their future. I will leave you with the words of one of our great children's authors. 'It is really important that focusing on things such as spelling, punctuation, grammar and handwriting doesn't inhibit the creative flow. When I was at school there was a huge focus on copying and testing and it put me off words and stories for years.' Michael Morpurgo




Y5 Seven Sisters Trip






RUGBY MATCH V ST.WILFRID'S




