


#### **Headteacher Message**

# MATHS WEEK






This week saw our children participating in numerous activities based around maths.

We had a mathemagician wow us with number conundrums, bake off within classes, treasure hunts around the school and some great mathematical challenges in the class rooms.










































#### **Year 4 Rainbow Theatre - Victorians**
