Headteacher Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

Do you know what the single biggest factor is in helping children make good progress in school? Is it class size? Teacher subject knowledge? Behaviour in class? Or the kind of home a child comes from? Whilst these all make a marginal difference to children's success all global research points to one dominant factor alone that has a huge and undeniable influence, way above all others. It is a child's own view of themselves as learners and an adult's expectations on that child. Where a child believes that they 'can' but maybe just not yet or when they are prepared to try and fail but will persevere until they get it 'right' will almost always determine ultimate success. In a well known experiment fleas were put in a jar and the researchers observed the fleas slowly but surely all escape by jumping out. They then repeated this but put the lid back on. After a few days they took the lid off. They found that the fleas would jump no higher than the top of the jar and none were able to escape. None of us can claim to have mastered a skill or learnt something new overnight. Very few of us can pick up a musical instrument and play it straight away. Indeed doing anything well takes a great deal of perseverance and this is what we teach our children. It is ok to make mistakes, fail but not give up. In short believe in themselves and see failure as an opportunity to grow. At Southway we concentrate on praising effort and accepting mistakes rather than solely looking at marks, grades or results as a measure of individual success.


