# **Headteacher Message**

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week I told you that we had been visited by two serving West Sussex Headteachers, one of whom is currently training to become an Ofsted registered inspector. The purpose of the visit was to evaluate the school's current view of itself and to offer advice in areas considered to need improvement or further development. I am delighted to be able to share the main findings with you.

'There are **good systems and processes in place** and this is evident in all classrooms.

There was a good range of planned learning opportunities across the school. Some particularly strong and effective teaching in maths was seen throughout the visit and in some classes teachers used modelling and focused questioning to develop and challenge pupils' responses.

In the classes that we visited and the lessons that were observed, there was evidence that **learning was** differentiated.

The **learning environments were inviting** and scaffolded learning in classes across the school. There are some good examples of reading corners and the school has some exemplary practice to share.

Learning behaviours were consistently good across the school. The large majority of children across the school were engaged and enthusiastic.

There was very good evidence of marking and feedback in books. This was particularly true across most of the Key Stage. Where children were provided with specific feedback and next steps for their learning, children responded well.

Standards and expectation of presentation in books was high across the school. Topic work was very well presented in topic books and on displays through the school.

**Teaching assistants supported children's learning well**; they were well briefed and used questioning effectively.'

#### **Behaviour and Ethos**


Based on the evidence gathered during the day, we agree with the school's self-evaluation of strongly good to outstanding in this category.

It was evident from the day that expectations of children's behaviour were high. Children were very polite and demonstrated very positive attitudes to learning. In all classes visited, children were keen to talk about their work and were clearly proud of what they had achieved. There were very good relationships between staff and pupils.'

I am pleased to note that there were no areas that were considered in any way a cause for concern and the report itself agrees with the school's own view of itself.
