Dear Parents and Carers,

As I write this message our Year 6 children will have completed their SATs and will now be looking forward to a well-earned weekend break. I would like to compliment them all for their efforts and concentration not only during the week itself but also for all of their hard work in the lead up to the tests themselves. We know that these tests are a very narrow and sometimes misleading measure of a child's ability. Along with the vast majority of Headteachers in this country I am increasingly concerned at the punitive and restrictive nature of the new tests which further narrow the curriculum. A group of Headteachers in London, that lead either good or outstanding primary schools, wrote to the education secretary, Nicky Morgan, to outline their concerns. With specific reference to writing in the curriculum they said, 'The emphasis is now on reducing stories and texts into monotonous and complex reconstructions. We would defy most adults to read and write to the current year 6 expectations.'


Of course we work tirelessly to ensure that all of our children are literate and numerate and ready to meet the challenges of secondary education. We recognise that academic success is a good indicator of future economic success later in life. But we also know that our children achieve in so many other vital ways. During my Monday assembly we spoke about what everyone would like to be when they grew up. The answers ranged from marine biologist to Olympic gymnast, from astronaut to professional pianist. I am delighted that our children have such a positive view of their futures and are dreaming big. At Southway it is wonderful to see that our children have a far wider and interesting perspective on their future possibilities than the narrow measures used by successive governments. Are Children Spending Too Long On Electronic Gizmos?

I have noticed an increasing trend of children aged 6-14 coming in specifically for help with neck pain.

When I'm then asking the children and the parents what happened leading up to the pain, to find out why it started, I'm noticing a possible common factor.

It seems children are spending far longer on their tablets, laptops, smart phones and games consoles, and watching TV, now than ever before. And they are often sitting with bad postures while doing it.

This is a concern for me as an osteopath, because their bodies are still growing, and these slumped postures will not be helping keep their developing spines healthy.

After treatment to help the neck pain, a key factor to stop the problem coming back, was simply giving each of them advice about reducing screen time, as well as making sure they were holding their head upright when looking at a screen, sitting up straight.

A lot of my adult patients need to follow this advice too!

I know it can be difficult to get children to stop looking at screens, but for their spinal health it's vital to think about this. The least time they can spend with their head in an odd position staring at a screen, is definitely better for them.

They will have less pain and aches in their neck and backs.


