Dear parents and carers

As a child I developed a love of reading early on. I was fortunate that my mum was happy to send me off to the local library with my sister, where we would spend a few hours each week, immersed in good stories. I fed my imagination and took great pleasure in being a member of the Secret Seven in my mind! I also found an author that had a lifelong impact on me, Alan Garner, who wrote The Weirdstone of Brisingamen and other wonderful tales that transported me to other worlds (They are still in print and I can't recommend them highly enough). This year, as part of our ongoing determination to be the best school we can be for our children, we are having a whole school focus on reading. For the past few years we have had considerable success in raising children's achievements but we know there is always room for improvement. Amongst the new initiatives we have introduced are giving all children the opportunity to visit Burgess Hill Library once per term. These sessions are structured and include various challenges as well as storytelling.

We have also introduced a raffle system. Every teacher will be giving out one ticket a day to children that impress them with their enthusiasm, insight or sheer hard work around reading. Every month I will hold a book assembly where I will pick a winner for each year group. The winners will receive a copy of a brand new book funded by the school. The two books up for grabs this month are 'The Eye of the Wolf' by Daniel Pennac and 'My Brother is a Superhero' by David Solomons. Having mentioned in my assembly that children seen reading in the storytelling garden would be noted and mentioned to their teachers I was gratified to see upwards of 80 children at the next break-time busily reading. I'm all in favour of a little bribery if it has the desired effect!
