Monday 11th April.


The winning entry will be submitted to the council and subsequently sent to the Queen.

The Royal Marsden was the first hospital in the world dedicated to the study and treatment of cancer. It was

founded as the Free Cancer Hospital in 1851 by Dr William Marsden. It is an NHS Foundation Trust, and operates facilities on two sites

The Marsden March is a 14-mile or a 5-mile sponsored walk between The Royal Marsden's hospitals in Chelsea and Sutton. Over the last five years this event has raised an amazing $\pounds 6.5$ million to help build a future beyond cancer.

"We walked in memory of Aiden Stiebahl-Breeds, but also for friends and family who have needed, will need and are going to unfortunately need their amazing care.

The event took place on the 13th March and 5'500 people took part and Linda and myself made it in 4hrs and 39 minutes.... and have so far managed to raise nearly £700 for the cause...."


