

Dear Parents and Carers,

Why is high attendance important to my child's education?

I was recently considering the importance of regular school attendance as a key indicator to a child's future success. Several years ago attendance at Southway was below the national average. Over recent years and with the support of the parents, we have managed to remain consistently above national averages, at around 96%. The government have set all schools and parents a minimum target of 95% attendance over a school year and when a child starts to fall below that figure the school is obliged to find out why this is the case and if necessary support the family.

The latest research on school attendance throws up some important statistics that I would like to share with you. A child who is absent a day of school per week misses an equivalent of two years of their school life. 90% of young people with absence rates below 85% fail to achieve five or more good grades of GCSE and around one third achieve no GCSEs at all. Poor examination results limit young people's options and poor attendance suggests to colleges and employers that these students are unreliable. Poor school attendance is also closely associated with crime; a quarter of school age offenders have truanted repeatedly. 7.5 million school days are missed each year through unauthorised absence.

This year we set the school the ambitious target of 97% attendance for the year and we are currently at 96%. With your help our target could become a reality.
