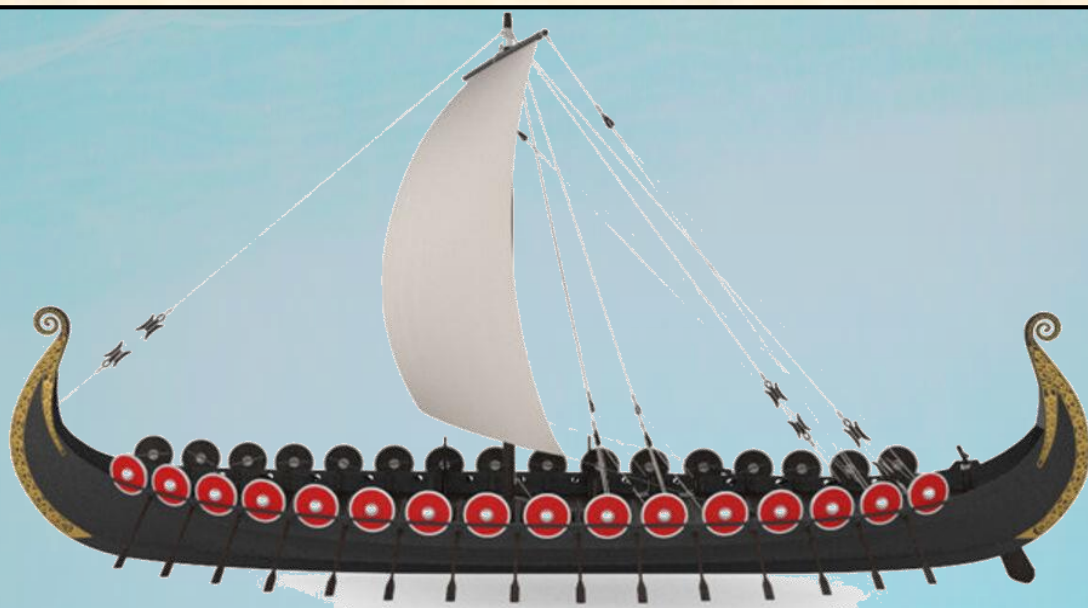
Maths: We will solve word problems, explore mathematical investigations and get to grips with measuring, shape and time.

Science: We will be learning all about light and the children will completing a range of investigations to underpin their learning.

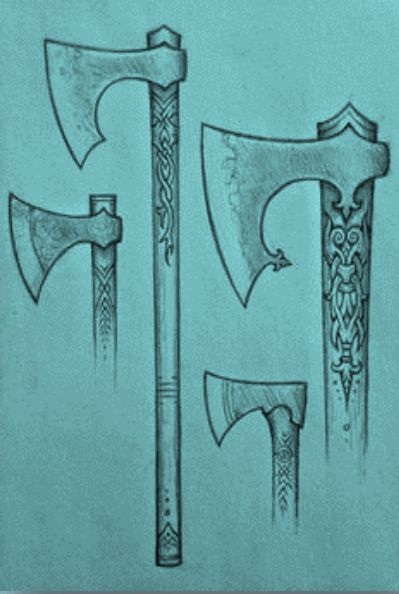
D&T: We will be examining how and why invaders suffered from scurvy to inspire us to create food to help combat this problem! We will also create a picture frame in woodwork.
