# School Improvement Visit

We have recently received our annual inspection report from the Local Authority, designed to categorise the school against the current Ofsted Framework and determine how effective the school is. During the visit, our Education Adviser and governors visited classrooms and observed a vibrant, supportive and a well ordered school environment. The focus of the visit to classrooms was to look at mathematics and observe the recent fine tuning of teaching sequences. The consistency of approach in all year groups was celebrated alongside teachers following an agreed lesson structure and applying routines for practise. Planned opportunities for reasoning and problem solving were clearly evident in all lessons and pupils were very enthusiastic about attempting the challenge activities. Teachers were seen modelling and addressing misconceptions. It was noted that as a result of the consistent approach to teaching and learning across the school, our end of key stage outcomes in reading are above the national average and in mathematics they are significantly above. The school Category is 2i: Highly Effective – Highly effective with evidence of significant strengths in school effectiveness. Well done team!


